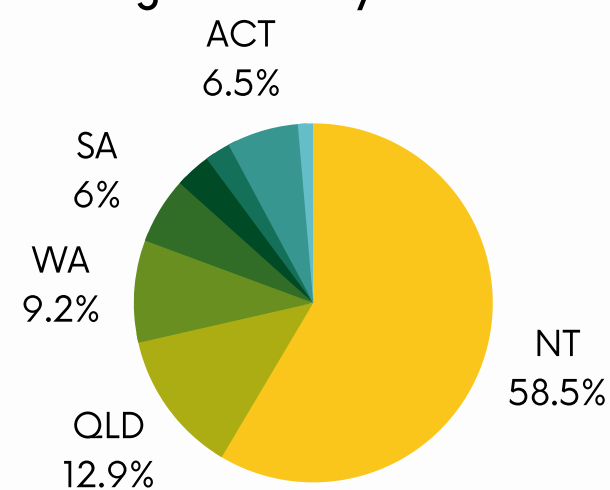

- 243 women & 248 children have participated in Wave 2 research assessments
