Keynote Speakers



Professor Kristen Nadeau

Indigenous Professor of Pediatric Endocrinology and Vice Chair of Clinical Research in the Department of Pediatrics, University of Colorado, USA. Professor Nadeau's work focuses on reducing long-term complications of youth-onset diabetes and obesity. She led the NIDDK U01 RISE β -cell preservation study in youth and adults and was Chair of the JDRF study of metformin in youth with T1D. She is Co-PI of the NIH ST2OMP study of bariatric surgery in youth-onset T2D, and Vice Chair for the NIDDK DISCOVERY U01 study investigating precursors of T2D in youth.



Professor Helen Murphy

Professor of Medicine in Diabetes and Antenatal Care at the University of East Anglia, and a practicing clinician at Norfolk and Norwich University Hospital NHS Trust, UK. Professor Murphy runs a diabetes pregnancy research program to support women with diabetes to achieve pregnancy glucose targets required for optimal mother and baby health outcomes. She co-led the CONCEPTT Continuous Glucose Monitoring trial, resulting in international changes in clinical practice. CGM is now the recognised standard of care for pregnant women with T1D.
